Background on Subcommittee

- Four in-person meetings; Sept. Nov. 2018
- Participation from a wide variety of stakeholders
- Identified valuable areas for further discussion
- Consumer Rights cross over each sub committee

Areas of Consensus

- Identified three important focus areas:
 - 1) Strengthening rights
 - 2) Enforcement of rights
 - 3) Education about rights

Prohibition against Retaliation

- Consensus
 - Improve Regulatory Enforcement
 - Retaliation Must Be Addressed/Prohibited

- Additional Points
 - Clear Definition, Burden-Shifting Framework
 - Private Right of Action

Consistent Enforcement of Rights in Assisted Living

- Consensus
 - Better Regulatory Enforcement of Home Care Statutes/Bill of Rights
 - Consider Increased Penalties for Violations

- Additional Points
 - Criminal Penalties, Private Right of Action
 - Rights and Duties Clearly Defined

Resident and Family Councils in Assisted Living

- Consensus
 - Residents Must Have Freedom to Organize
 - Available Space for Meetings
- Value of Councils
 - Councils Can Raise Consumer Voice, Reduce Retaliation Fears, Streamline Concerns

Consensus Area – Additional Funding for OOLTC

OOLTC Authority

- Older Americans Act ("OAA") (42 U.S.C. § 3058g)
- Minnesota Ombudsman Statute (Minn. Stat. § 256.9742)
- Minnesota Board on Aging ("MBA") Administers Ombudsman Program through OAA funds
- Federal Administration Community
 Living/Administration on Aging holds OOLTC
 accountable for ombudsman program compliance


Sexual Abuse in Northern Minnesota

 Financial Exploitation and Isolation in Southwest Minnesota


Minnesota Ranks Worst

 - Some regional assignments larger than 9 states


Nursing Homes by Region – Greater Minnesota




<u>Assisted Living/HWS by Region – Greater Minnesota</u>




Nursing Homes By Region - Metro
