

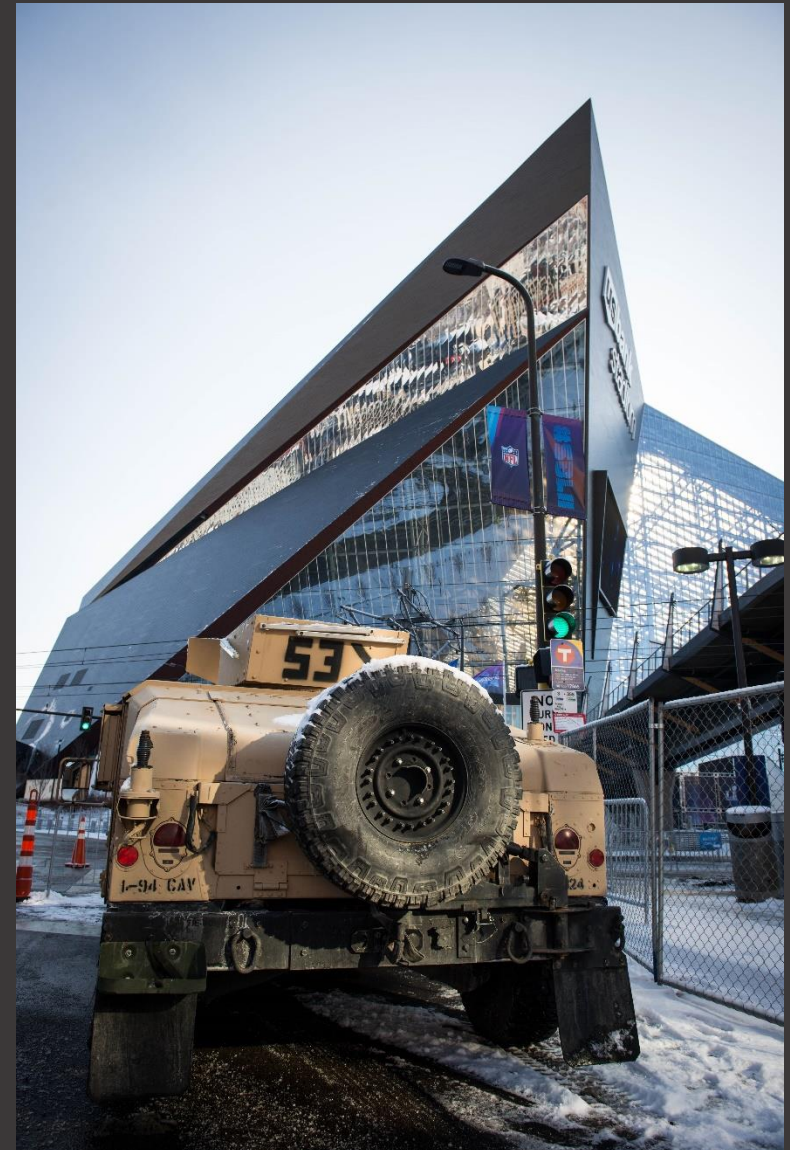

**Our bottom line responsibility is to be ready to fight our nation's wars and win. Everything we do supports and is connected to our primary responsibility.**

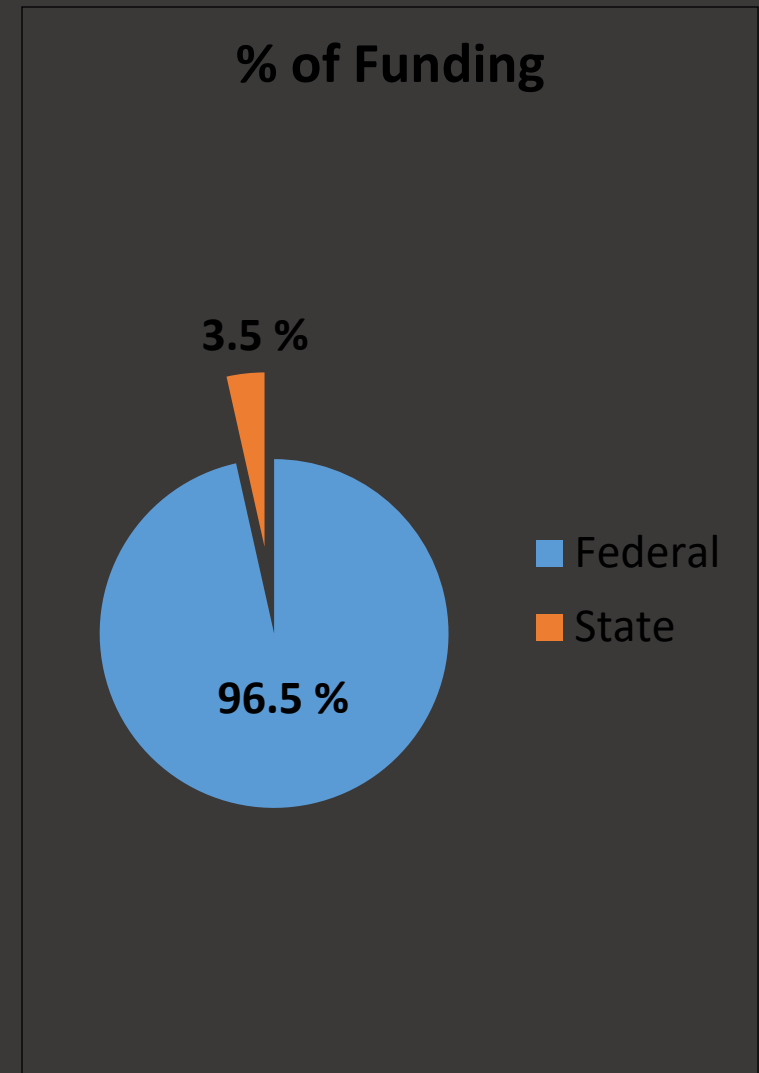

# CAMP RIPLEY

## 53,000-acre regional training facility

- Supported **383,000** military training days and **56,000** training days for local and state interagency partners
- Economic impact of **\$72,721,318**
- Utilized by the military, federal, state, local and civilian communities
- Recognized by Department of Defense for cultural resource management and by the Environmental Protection Agency as the Federal Green Challenge award winner.

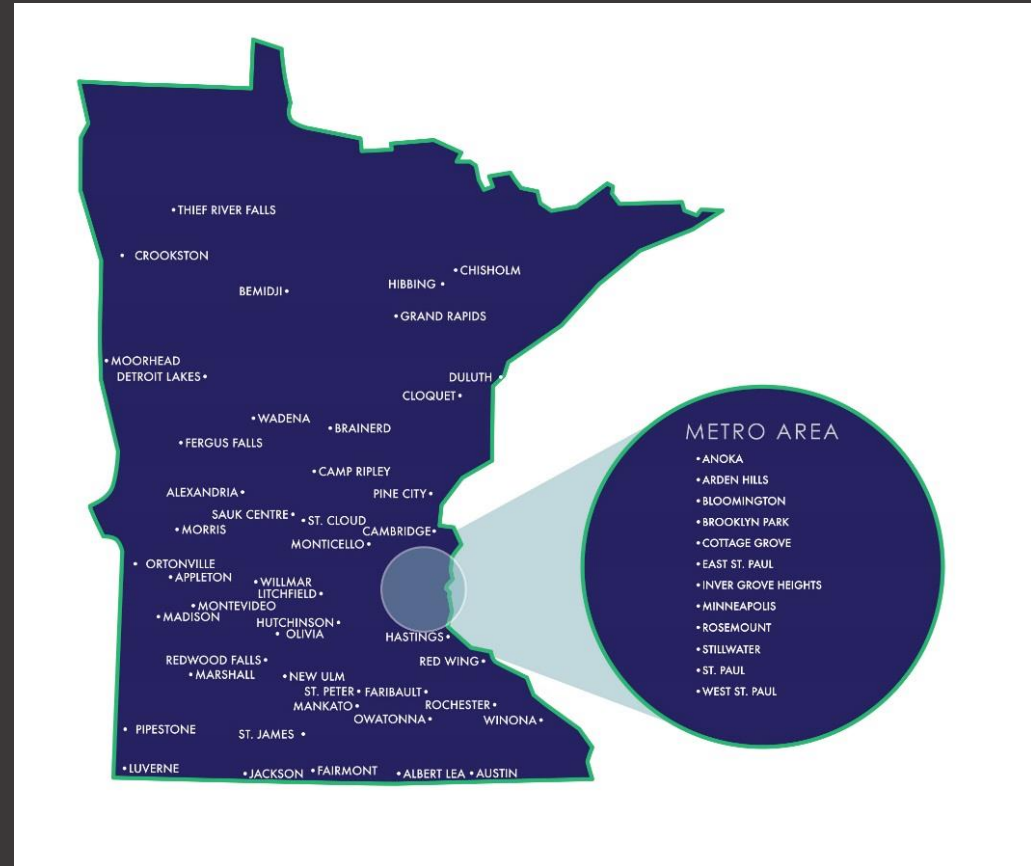




# STATEWIDE PRESENCE

## 61 facilities located in 58 Communities

- Add value to each community by providing armories, air bases and local training areas to train **13,149** Soldiers and Airmen from across the state
- Armories host a variety of community events - from ceremonies to wedding receptions to emergencies
- The doors are open to serve the community 365 days a year.





# OUR FEDERAL MISSION

## 9/11 changed everything

- Transformed from strategic reserve to operational force
- No more “weekend warriors”



## MNNG mobilized more than 26,000

- Air: 10,000

# DOMESTIC OPERATIONS

- Civil Support Team (CST)
  - Detect, identify, analyze, assist
- Emergency Response Force (CERF)
  - Decontamination, heavy rescue, medical triage
- Counterdrug Program (CD)
  - Demand reduction, analysis, eradication
- Cyber Protection Team (CPT)
- Community support







# Yellow Ribbon Reintegration Program

- Post 1 event
  - Completed between 30 and 180 days post deployment
  - Provides resources for crisis and immediate needs
- Post 2 event
  - Completed in the first year post deployment
  - Provides lifestyle and steady state resources
- Family preparation academies
- Initial Soldier preparation





# YELLOW RIBBON NETWORKS

- Vital community-based support for Service members and their families
- As of Jan 2019
  - 90 Yellow Ribbon Networks
  - 65 Yellow Ribbon Companies





# EDUCATION

- Federal Tuition Benefits
  - GI Bill
  - Federal Tuition Assistance
  - \$2,482,201 dollars went to 1035 soldiers in FY18
- State Education
  - State Tuition Reimbursement
  - \$8,981,125 went to 1,555 soldiers and airmen in CY18
- STARBASE
  - DoD Funded STEM Program
  - Grades 4-6
  - More than 50,000 students since 1993

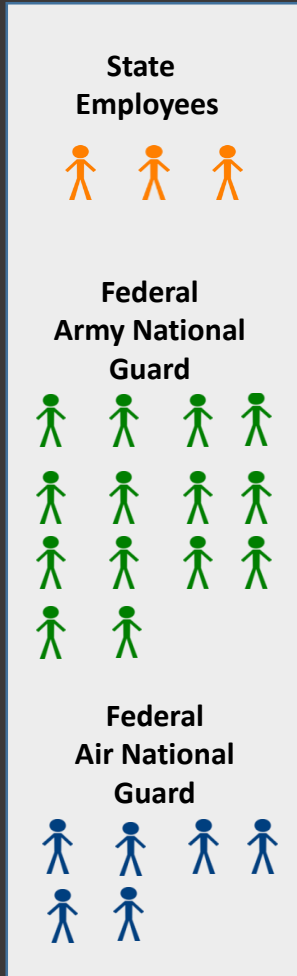

# Military Affairs

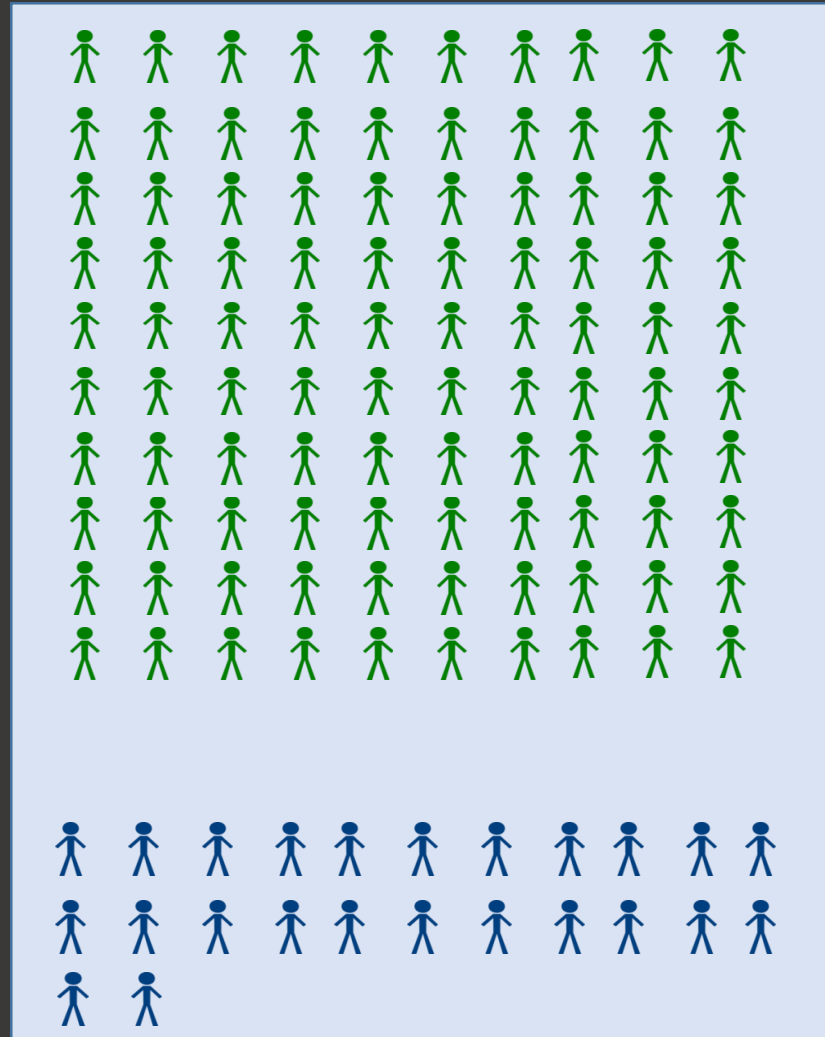

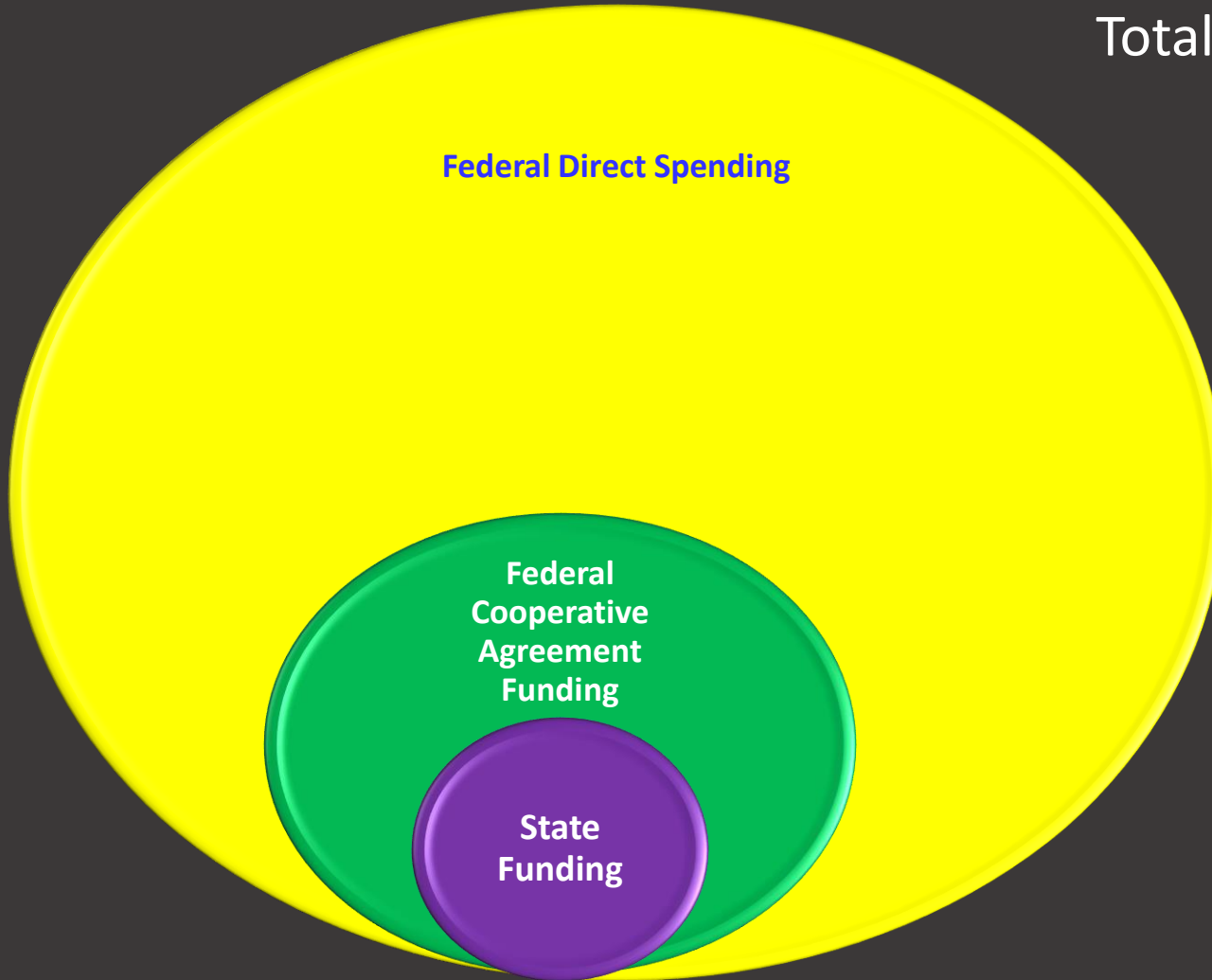


## Citizen Soldiers and Airmen
