| 1.12 1.13 | Section 1. [11A.236] ACCOUNT TO INVEST FINANCIAL ASSURANCE MONEY FROM PERMITS TO MINE. |
| 1.14 | Subdivision 1. Establishment; appropriation. (a) The State Board of Investment, when |
| 1.15 | requested by the commissioner of natural resources, may invest money collected by the |
| 1.16 | commissioner as part of financial assurance provided under a permit to mine issued under |
| 1.17 | chapter 93. The State Board of Investment may establish one or more accounts into which |
| 1.18 | money may be deposited for the purposes of this section, subject to the policies and |
| 1.19 | procedures of the State Board of Investment. Use of any money in the account is restricted |
| 1.20 | to the financial assurance purposes identified in sections 93.46 to 93.51 and rules adopted |
| 1.21 | thereunder and as authorized under any trust fund agreements or other conditions established |

Subd. 2. Account maintenance and investment. The commissioner of natural resources 2.1 may deposit money in the appropriate account and may withdraw money from the appropriate 2.2 account for the financial assurance purposes identified in sections 93.46 to 93.51 and rules 2.3 adopted thereunder and as authorized under any trust fund agreements or other conditions 2.4 established under the permit to mine for which the financial assurance is provided, subject 2.5 to the policies and procedures of the State Board of Investment. Investment strategies related 2.6 to an account established under this section must be determined jointly by the commissioner 2.7 of natural resources and the executive director of the State Board of Investment. The 2.8 authorized investments for an account are the investments authorized under section 11A.24 2.9 that are made available for investment by the State Board of Investment. Investment 2.10 transactions must be at a time and in a manner determined by the executive director of the 2.11 State Board of Investment. Decisions to withdraw money from the account must be 2.12 determined by the commissioner of natural resources, subject to the policies and procedures 2.13 of the State Board of Investment. Investment earnings must be credited to the appropriate 2.14 account for financial assurance under the identified permit to mine. An account may be 2.15 terminated by the commissioner of natural resources at any time, so long as the termination 2.16 is in accordance with applicable statutes, rules, trust fund agreements, or other conditions 2.17 established under the permit to mine, subject to the policies and procedures of the State 2.18 Board of Investment. 2.19 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 84.946, subdivision 4, is amended to read: 2.20 Subd. 4. Priorities; report. The commissioner of natural resources must establish 2.21 priorities for natural resource asset preservation and replacement projects. By January 15 2.22 March 1 each year, the commissioner must submit to the commissioner of management and 2.23 budget a list of the projects that have been paid for with money from a natural resource 2.24 asset preservation and replacement appropriation during the preceding calendar year. 2.25

Subdivision 1. State Park Open House Days. (a) A state park permit is not required
for a motor vehicle to enter a state park, state monument, state recreation area, or state

designate as State Park Open House Days. The commissioner may designate two consecutive
days as State Park Open House Days, if the open house is held in conjunction with a special
pageant described in section 85.052, subdivision 2.
