1.2 Page 18, after line 24, insert:

1.3 "Sec. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 626.8432, subdivision 2, is amended to read:

1.4 Subd. 2. **Mandatory revocation; discovery of disqualifying conviction after licensure;**
1.5 **termination for wrongful use of force.** (a) The board ~~may suspend or shall~~ revoke a peace
1.6 officer or part-time peace officer license when:

1.7 (1) the licensee has been convicted of a crime recognized by the board as a crime that
1.8 would disqualify the licensee from participating in a professional peace officer education
1.9 course, taking the peace officer licensing examination or the part-time peace officer licensing
1.10 examination, or maintaining eligibility for licensure under Minnesota Rules, chapter 6700;
1.11 or

1.12 (2) is terminated for a violation of the agency's use of force policy.

1.13 (b) The authority to suspend or revoke a license shall include all individuals who have
1.14 been granted a license when a disqualifying conviction that would have precluded eligibility
1.15 for licensure is discovered after licensure.

1.16 (c) If the board revokes the license of an officer under paragraph (a), clause (1), and the
1.17 officer is later reinstated after an appeal of the officer's termination, the board must reconsider
1.18 the decision to revoke the officer's license."

1.19 Page 19, after line 4, insert:

1.20 "Sec. **[626.8435] MANDATORY REPORTING PEACE OFFICER**
1.21 **TERMINATIONS AND RESIGNATIONS.**

1.22 A chief law enforcement officer must report to the Peace Officer Standards and Training
1.23 Board when a peace officer is discharged or resigns from employment due to misconduct

2.1 or when a peace officer is suspended or resigns while a misconduct investigation is pending.
2.2 The report must be made to the board within ten days after the discharge, suspension, or
2.3 resignation has occurred. The board must investigate the report for and the reporting agency
2.4 must cooperate in the investigation. Notwithstanding any provision in chapter 13 or any
2.5 law to the contrary, upon written request from the board the law enforcement agency shall
2.6 provide the board with information about the peace officer from the agency's files, any
2.7 termination or disciplinary proceeding, any settlement or compromise, or any investigative
2.8 file."
