**Subject** H.F. 2929 amendments

The table below provides a summary of the amendments offered to House File 2929.

DE2	Child care licensing modernization (redraft of H4382DE4).

A5	H.F. 4432—Child care assistance program absent days limit exemption established.

Amendment	Description
A6	H.F. 45—Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Outreach Program appropriation.
A7	H.F. 2136—Grant funding provided for forensic interview training scholarships appropriation. H.F. 3750—Requires DCYF to establish licensing for crisis nurseries. H.F. 4174—Parent support outreach program appropriation.
A8	Establishes the Board of Early Care and Education.
A9	Increases the number of licenses DCYF may approve for different family child care programs located on the same site or under one contiguous roof from four to six.
A10	Amends the family child care licensing article based on recommendations from both family child care stakeholders and DCYF.
A11	Amends the family child care licensing article based on recommendations by DCYF.
A12	Amends the child care center licensing article based on recommendations made by the Minnesota Child Care Association and approved by DCYF.
A13	Amends the child care center and family child care licensing articles based on recommendations from nature-based child care programs.
A14	Technical amendment from DCYF to align the definition and usage of “commissioner” with current law.
A15	Minnesota African American Family Preservation and Child Welfare Disproportionality Act: adds a section detailing how the commissioner must determine the communities that are disproportionately represented for purposes of the act, moves case review responsibility from the responsible social services agencies (primarily counties) to the commissioner and requires the commissioner to review 10% of each agency's cases, modifies cultural competency training requirements, provides an expiration date for the working group, appropriates money to distribute to responsible social services agencies for implementation, and makes technical, clarifying, and conforming changes.
A16	Deletes the family child care licensing article.
A17	Exempts a family child care program license holder or caregiver providing care to their own child from capacity, ratio, and distribution requirements if the child is nine years of age or older.
A18	Miscellaneous changes pertaining to both the child care center and family child care articles.
