1.7	(a) \$37,500,000 in fiscal year 2023 and \$37,500,000 in fiscal year 2024 are appropriated
1.8	from the general fund to the commissioner of human services for a grant to Ramsey County
1.9	to fund and support Heading Home Ramsey Continuum of Care. The grant must be used
1.10	<u>for:</u>
1.11	(1) maintaining funding for a 100-bed family shelter;
1.12	(2) maintaining funding to provide shelter and services for single adults, including
1.13	expanded shelter for women;
1.14	(3) developing and operating a familiar faces pilot program for high-frequency unhoused
