



House Property Tax Division HF4399 – Increasing County Program Aid (CPA)

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Counties are key state partners, responsible for local administration of a vast array of state-determined programs

County Program Aid is the state's primary general purpose state aid for counties

- Helps offset the cost of state mandates
- Supports general property tax relief for all property owners

County Program Aid appropriation amounts are not annually adjusted for inflation, periodic base adjustments are needed to maintain the primary objectives of CPA



County Program Aid Formula



Need Aid

Roughly 45% of the appropriation distributed based on three demographic factors:

- Age-adjusted population (more aid for higher concentration of persons 65+)
- Part I Crimes
- SNAP Households

Tax Base Equalization

Roughly 55% of the appropriation and generally formatted to provide more aid to counties with lower tax base.

•<u>Formula:</u>

- N x (\$190 x population 9.45% of the county adjusted net tax capacity)
- A county cannot receive less than 95% of its prior year aid amount


 Target of most recent aid revisions enacted in 2017






CPA has declined as a percent of total county levy

- about ½ the level it was at in 2002




Current appropriation is at about the level it was twenty years ago – unadjusted for inflation








Had CPA kept pace with inflation and/or population growth, it would be higher
