- Increasing the numbers and types of students, graduates, teachers, and community members involved in AFNR education to meet present and future needs
- Making accurate and complete information widely available to students, parents, school administrators, teachers, and employers to improve understanding of AFNR systems
- Ensuring AFNR education programs at all levels are fully supported locally and statewide



MAELC Funding

In 1997 the Minnesota Legislature provided a biennial special appropriation to the University of Minnesota base level funding for the enhancement of agricultural education programming.

Original allocation was \$300,000





Program Grant Funds



- -Developing or improvement of AFNR courses


Teacher Professional Development
