Dear Madam Chair and Members:

I write in support of House File 393. This bill would provide Minnesotans with additional protections to help vindicate their rights in disputes with their public utilities. Accordingly, I encourage the House Climate and Energy Finance and Policy Committee to advance this important bill.

One of my duties as Attorney General is to advocate for residential and small business utility customers, per Minn. Stat. § 8.33. My role as a ratepayer advocate is central to my mission to help Minnesotans afford their lives and live with dignity, safety, and respect. The ability to access safe, reliable, and affordable electric and natural gas service is essential. Minnesotans depend on these services to heat their homes in cold Minnesota winters and power the technologies required to participate in modern society. Occasionally, ratepayers will have complaints with respect to their public utilities. Unfortunately, when individual customers have concerns with large corporations, they suffer from an appreciable power disparity and sometimes require assistance in order to vindicate their rights.

House File 393 would improve, clarify, and codify significant procedural protections for ratepayers seeking to file complaints against their public utilities. Specifically, the bill includes a complaint resolution procedure, a process for appealing the outcome of their complaint to the Public Utilities Commission, and a mechanism for seeking judicial review of the Commission's process. I enthusiastically support House File 393 urge you to pass it.
