COVID Impact - 2021 & 2022

- Revenue Declined \$750,000 (30%)
 - ▶ \$2.65 million to \$1.86 million
 - Holmes Theatre 70% reduction
- ► Staffing
 - February 2020 150 employees
 - ► Summer 2020 15 employees
 - 2021 Carefully adding employees
 - ► February 2022 95 employees

Costs –

- Air Filtration System
- Protective Equipment
- Limiting # of Attendees for Performances/ Programs/Classes





COVID Impact - 2021 & 2022

- Impact on Organization was huge. Impact on Community was heartbreaking!
 - Fewer Performances = Economic Loss to Restaurants/Hotels
 - Isolation = Social Hub of DL Shuttered for All Ages


