relating to liquor; allowing Minneapolis and St. Paul to extend certain zoning, licensing, or approvals for certain damaged liquor stores.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. SPECIAL OFF-SALE PROVISION; MINNEAPOLIS AND ST. PAUL.

A bill for an act

- (a) The cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul may extend any interim zoning, liquor licensing, or other approvals granted to any exclusive liquor store if the building housing a liquor store at its current location was damaged beyond reasonable repair due to the unrest occurring between May 25 and June 8, 2020, to permit the ongoing interim operation of a business in a temporary structure prior to the relocation of the business to a permanent facility at the original premises or elsewhere, notwithstanding limitations of law, local ordinances, or charter provisions relating to zoning or liquor licensing.
- (b) The cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul may grant, renew, or otherwise reissue any existing off-sale intoxicating liquor license to an exclusive liquor store described in paragraph (a) upon the relocation of a liquor store to a permanent facility, notwithstanding limitations of law, local ordinances, or charter provisions relating to liquor licensing or contiguous zoning requirements.
- EFFECTIVE DATE. (a) For the city of Minneapolis, this section is effective upon
 approval by the Minneapolis City Council and compliance with Minnesota Statutes, section
 645.021.
- (b) For the city of St. Paul, this section is effective upon approval by the St. Paul City
 Council and compliance with Minnesota Statutes, section 645.021.
