Although Como has a Free admission policy, a voluntary donation program generates \$1.4 million each year. These funds make up 17% of Como's annual \$8.1 million annual operating budget. The City of Saint Paul's general fund contributes 41% of the annual budget. The remaining 58% includes private support through Como Friends and earned revenues from concessions and the amusement park. Como operates at a cost of \$4.49 per visitor. Other similar Minnesotan cultural destinations range \$13.50-\$45.00 per visitor.

A recent economic impact study found that Como Park Zoo and Conservatory generates \$162.7 million in economic impact for the Minnesota economy each year. It also helps generate 2,093 jobs.
