

Subject Grants to Secondary Schools for Emergency Medical Services Courses

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Overview

H.F. 2031 appropriates \$1,000,000 per year to the Department of Education, beginning in fiscal year 2023, for grants to school districts, charter schools, and cooperative units to expand programming offerings in the area of emergency medical services.

Summary

Section	Description
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1	Appropriation; emergency medical training.
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Appropriates \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2023 from the general fund to the Department of Education for grants to school districts to offer emergency medical services courses to high school students. Requires the grants to be made to applicants in Greater Minnesota and the metropolitan area, and to the extent possible, encourages grants to applicants with programs serving high concentrations of students of color.

Authorizes a school district, charter school, or cooperative unit to apply for a grant to offer a course approved by the Minnesota Emergency Medical Services Regulatory Board. States that the goal of the course is to prepare high school students to take the emergency medical technician certification test and serve as a prerequisite to an emergency medical technician course.

Authorizes the grant recipient to partner with: other school districts, charter schools and cooperative units; postsecondary institutions; other political subdivisions (cities and counties); and others with emergency medical service expertise including health systems, hospitals, ambulance services, and health care providers.



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
