### **Bill Description**

Proposes prohibition of manufacturing, sale, or distribution of food packaging that contains intentionally added Perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) chemicals. Provides for enforcement by MPCA. Requires coordination with Departments of Commerce and Health. Requires MN Dept. of Health (MDH) to amend the health risk limit for PFOS by July 1, 2023. And appropriates funds from the Environmental Fund to go to the MPCA for transfer to MDH.

## **Assumptions**

Work would begin January 1, 2022, halfway into FY22. One FTE will be needed for outreach and education, technical assistance, complaint response, random purchasing and sampling and screening of products, conducting any necessary enforcement follow-up, and coordination with other state agencies. MPCA will need to purchase some products for testing. Funds are needed to support a competitively-selected laboratory in developing PFAS screening, extraction and/or analytical techniques for the variety of materials found in food packaging. If the screening indicates the presence of PFAS, samples will be tested in an accredited lab.

We assumed MDH would complete 100% of the rulemaking so there would be no cost to the Agency.

The cost for handling the transfer of funds from the MPCA to MDH is negligible and would be covered by existing funds.

#### **Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula**

Lab contract to develop PFAS screening and testing method = \$30,000

Sample purchases \$10/product x 200 products = \$2,000

Lab tests \$400/sample x 20 tests = \$8,000

1 FTE = \$128,000

\*The annual cost of 1.0 FTE is \$128,000 in FY2021-2024. Annual costs for 1.0 FTE include salary, fringe, and non-specialized employee support costs (work space, computer and office supplies, office equipment, local travel, etc.)

### **Bill Description**

HF79-1E prohibits the intentional use of PFAS chemicals in the manufacturing of food packaging items. The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) has primary enforcement responsibility outlined in the proposal but must coordinate with the Commerce Department and Minnesota Department of Health.

### **Assumptions**

The Commerce Department would assist MPCA in potential enforcement action similar to our current roll in enforcing laws in response to existing bans on chemicals in children's products.

### **Bill Description**

This bill would ban the manufacture, distribution for sale or use, and sale of food packaging that contains intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) beginning January 1, 2023. The enforcement authority lies with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA), in coordination with Departments of Health and Commerce. The bill adds Minnesota Statutes, chapter 325F. HF79-1E adds a requirement to HF79 that MDH promulgate a Health Risk Limit (HRL) for perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) that does not exceed 0.015 parts per billion by July 1, 2023. It also provides a blank appropriation to do this work.

#### **Assumptions**

The department works closely with the MPCA on similar initiatives, and we assume this coordination would be similar to those initiatives. While the department would not take a direct role in enforcing this section, MPCA is directed to coordinate with the commissioner of health in its enforcement. Specifically, the department assumes our role will be to coordinate with MPCA for outreach, messaging, and education generally and when they find unapproved packaging via complaints or testing. In similar sized programs, staffing equivalent to 0.5 FTE is required to assist with outreach, messaging, and communication efforts.

The health department also regulates food establishments where these products may be used as packaging for the end consumer. The department assumes no cost or responsibility to enforce this requirement in licensed food establishments as the bill places the regulations in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 325F, and not in the health department's primary food safety regulatory statute, chapter 157. Additionally, the bill explicitly states that the "commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency may enforce this section" in section 1, subdivision 3. Subdivision 3 does include a coordinating role for the health department, which is covered in our assumptions above.

MDH has a biennial review and rulemaking process for contaminants and has already initiated the health risk limit (HRL) rule amendment process for perflourooctane sulfonate (PFOS) as part of this cycle. Initial request for public comment was issued in January of 2021. A proposed PFOS HRL of 0.015 parts per billion is included in the proposed amendment (see *References/Sources*). There is no additional projected cost to MDH to amend the HRL for PFOS.
