

2015 Minnesota Older Americans Act Profile




The Minnesota Board on Aging (MBA) is the designated State Unit on Aging for Minnesota. In that role, MBA's primary responsibility is the administration of Older Americans Act funding and programs to the over 1,000,000 Minnesota citizens who are age 60 and older. The Board also manages the Senior LinkAge Line®: One Stop Shop for Minnesota Seniors. Each year, the Minnesota Board on Aging provides a comprehensive report of the services provided through federal Older Americans Act and State of Minnesota funding to the federal Administration for Community Living. This report provides a picture of the services and activities for 2015. Data for this report was gathered from several sources: NAPIS (The National Aging Programs Information System), MBA Grant Utility and the MinnesotaHelp Network™ tools used by the Senior LinkAge Line®. 


CONSUMERS LIVING ALONE




WHERE CONSUMERS LIVE
