1.4 "Sec. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 160.262, subdivision 3, is amended to read:

1.5 Subd. 3. **Cooperation among agencies and governments; assistance.** (a) The
1.6 departments and agencies on the ~~nonmotorized~~ active transportation advisory committee
1.7 identified in section 174.37 must provide information and advice for the bikeway design
1.8 guidelines maintained by the commissioner of transportation. The commissioner may
1.9 cooperate with and enter into agreements with the United States government, any department
1.10 of the state of Minnesota, any unit of local government, any tribal government, or any public
1.11 or private corporation in order to effect the purposes of this section.

1.12 (b) The commissioner must provide technical assistance to local units of government
1.13 in:

1.14 (1) local planning and development of bikeways;

1.15 (2) establishing connections to state bicycle routes; and

1.18 Subd. 1b. **State bicycle routes.** The commissioner of transportation must identify state
1.19 bicycle routes primarily on existing road right-of-way and trails. State bicycle routes must
1.20 be identified in cooperation with road and trail authorities, including the commissioner of
1.21 natural resources, and with the advice of the advisory committee on ~~nonmotorized~~ active
1.22 transportation under section 174.37. In a metropolitan area, state bicycle routes must be

2.1 identified in coordination with the plans and priorities established by metropolitan planning
2.2 organizations, as defined in United States Code, title 23, section 134.

2.4 to read:

2.5 Subd. 7. **Jim Oberstar Bikeway.** The Jim Oberstar Bikeway must originate in the city
2.6 of St. Paul in Ramsey County, then proceed north and east to Duluth in St. Louis County,
2.7 then proceed north and east along the shore of Lake Superior through Grand Marais in Cook
2.8 County to Minnesota's boundary with Canada, and there terminate."

2.11 **174.37 ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON ~~NONMOTORIZED~~ ACTIVE**
2.12 **TRANSPORTATION.**

2.13 Subdivision 1. **Purpose.** (a) The commissioner of transportation shall establish an
2.14 advisory committee on ~~nonmotorized~~ active transportation. The committee shall make
2.15 recommendations to the commissioner on items related to:

2.16 (1) active transportation and nonmotorized transportation, including safety, education,
2.17 and development programs;

2.18 (2) the active transportation program under section 174.38; and

2.19 (3) the safe routes to school program under section 174.40.

2.20 (b) The committee shall review and analyze issues and needs relating to ~~operating~~
2.21 ~~nonmotorized~~ active transportation on public rights-of-way, and identify solutions and goals
2.22 for addressing identified issues and needs.

2.23 ~~(b)~~ (c) For purposes of this section, "~~nonmotorized~~ active transportation" includes
2.24 bicycling, pedestrian activities, and other forms of nonmotorized transportation.

2.25 Subd. 2. **Members.** (a) The advisory committee must consist of the following members:

2.26 ~~(a)~~ (b) The commissioner of transportation shall appoint up to 18 public members, as
2.27 follows: one member from each of the department's seven greater Minnesota districts; four
2.28 members from the department's metropolitan district; and no more than seven members at
2.29 large. Each of the members at large must represent nonmotorized interests or organizations.

3.1 ~~(b)~~ (c) The commissioners of each of the following state agencies shall appoint an
 3.2 employee of the agency to serve as a member: administration, education, health, natural
 3.3 resources, public safety, transportation, and pollution control. The chair of the Metropolitan
 3.4 Council shall appoint an employee of the council to serve as a member. The director of
 3.5 Explore Minnesota Tourism shall appoint an employee of the agency to serve as a member.
 3.6 The division administrator of the Federal Highway Administration may appoint an employee
 3.7 of the agency to serve as a member.

3.8 ~~(e)~~ (d) Members of the committee shall serve four-year terms.

3.9 Subd. 3. **Meetings.** ~~The commissioner of transportation's designee shall convene the~~
 3.10 ~~first meeting by January 15, 2009.~~ The committee shall elect a chair from its membership,
 3.11 and shall establish a meeting schedule and meet at least annually.

3.12 Subd. 4. **Reports.** The committee shall issue an annual report to the commissioner of
 3.13 transportation.

3.14 Subd. 5. **Expenses.** Members of the advisory committee serve without compensation,
 3.15 but members who are not employees of government agencies must be reimbursed for
 3.16 expenses in the same manner and amount as authorized by the commissioner's plan adopted
 3.17 under section 43A.18, subdivision 2. The commissioner of transportation shall provide
 3.18 department staff support to the committee.

3.19 Subd. 6. **Expiration.** The committee expires June 30, ~~2018~~ 2023.

3.20 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment. The
 3.21 commissioner of transportation must convene the next meeting by October 15, 2019."
