


## Redistricting 2020

What to Expect as You Get Started

Matt Gehring, House Research Department Minnesota House Committee on Redistricting May 15, 2021 Your constitutional responsibility: draw and enact maps that ensure that every address in Minnesota is represented by a full complement of elected legislative officials.



## The Minnesota Legislature is responsible for establishing new congressional and legislative district boundaries every ten years

#### CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA

4

- Sec. 2. **Apportionment of members.** The number of members who compose the senate and house of representatives shall be prescribed by law. The representation in both houses shall be apportioned equally throughout the different sections of the state in proportion to the population thereof.
- Sec. 3. Census enumeration apportionment; congressional and legislative district boundaries; senate districts. At its first session after each enumeration of the inhabitants of this state made by the authority of the United States, the legislature shall have the power to prescribe the bounds of congressional and legislative districts. Senators shall be chosen by single districts of convenient contiguous territory. No representative district shall be divided in the formation of a senate district. The senate districts shall be numbered in a regular series.

#### Important Dates

- April 1, 2020. Official U.S. Census Date
- December 31, 2020. April 26, 2021. Statewide population and Congressional reapportionment announcement
- Mid-Late August 2021. Release of "interim data product" by U.S. Census
- Mid-Late March, 2021. By September 30, 2021. Full Census dataset arrives
- February 15, 2022. Enactment of new district plans expected by law
- May 8, 2022. Deadline for legislative candidates to establish residence in district.
- May 17 May 31, 2022. Candidate filing period for 2022 state general election cycle
- August 9, 2022. State Primary Election







- Drawing and approval of maps: What will the new districts look like?




