Purpose


MDVA-proposed Policy Initiative for the 2024 Legislative Session to:

- Sunset obsolete Veterans Education benefits
- Incorporate like Veterans Education programs
- **Expand** Spouse and Dependent Child education benefits
- Consolidate authority for Veterans education programs under one division

Driving Factors


- Wilder Foundation Study Recommendations
- MDVA-identified need for benefit administration adjustment/streamlining
- Consolidation of Veterans Education Programs within MDVA under the Education and Occupational Resources Division (as of July 2024)

SSAP Education Benefit (Historical)



- Veteran Benefit is a Lifetime amount (profile matches "Surviving Child")
- Benefits from 1947-Pres reflects annual amounts
- Tuition Waiver instituted in 1953
- Benefits for dependents of POW/MIA instituted in 1983
- Spouses included as beneficiaries as of 2007
- MN GI Bill established in 2007

SSAP Education Benefit (Consumer Price Index - Trends)



• \$250 in 1943 = \$4,562


- \$350 in 1980 = \$1,387
- \$750 in 2001 = \$1,321

*Consumer Price Index value of original 1943 benefit equates to \$4,562 in 2024 dollars

Policy Initiative Components

- Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs (MDVA) is proposing to update Minn. Stat. §197.75 to include:
 - Maintain the current Surviving Spouse and Dependent Education Benefit to spouses and children of deceased Veterans
 - **Incorporate** the provisions of Minn. Stat. §197.752 (Educational Assistance to POW/MIA Dependents) within Minn. Stat. §197.75 and repeal Minn. Stat. §197.752 as a stand-alone statute.
 - Sunset the Veteran Education Benefit currently provided within Minn. Stat. §197.75
 - Increase the annual educational assistance stipend from \$750 to \$1,500 to account for inflation
 - Expand the Surviving Spouse and Dependent Education Benefit to spouses and children of Veterans with a service-connected disability of seventy percent (70%) or greater as rated by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs

Program Usage



- 103 vouchers processed in 2014
- Fewer than 40 vouchers processed in 2023

Calculation Considerations:

- Number of children per Veteran: 1.8 (US Census Bureau ACS data)
- Likelihood of Undergrad enrollment in a public institution
- Likelihood of attending in-state institution ۲
- "Take-up Rate" of eligible applicants to apply for benefit

 - **Consolidate** appropriations authority to expend Veterans Education funds under the MDVA Education and Occupational Resources Division
