1.5 Subdivision 1. **Six years.** ~~(a)~~ When any road or portion of a road has been used and kept
1.6 in repair and worked for at least six years continuously as a public highway by a road
1.7 authority, it shall be deemed dedicated to the public to the width of the actual use and be
1.8 and remain, until lawfully vacated, a public highway whether it has ever been established
1.9 as a public highway or not. Nothing contained in this subdivision shall impair the right,
1.10 title, or interest of the water department of any city of the first class secured under Special
1.11 Laws 1885, chapter 110. This subdivision shall apply to roads and streets except platted
1.12 streets within cities. ~~If a road authority fails to give the notice required by paragraph (b),~~
1.13 ~~this subdivision does not apply.~~

1.14 ~~(b) Before a road authority may make any repairs or conduct any work on a private road~~
1.15 ~~as defined by section 169.011, subdivision 57, the road authority must notify the owner of~~
1.16 ~~the road of the intent to make repairs or conduct work on the private road. The notice must~~
1.17 ~~be sent to the owner by certified mail. The notice must specify the segment of road that is~~
1.18 ~~the subject of the notice and state the duration of the repairs or work. The notice must include~~
1.19 ~~the following: "Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 160.05, your private road may be~~
1.20 ~~deemed to be dedicated to the public if the following conditions are met for six continuous~~
1.21 ~~years: (1) the road is used by the public; and (2) the road is repaired or worked on by a road~~

2.6 Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 164.07, subdivision 7, is amended to read:

2.7 Subd. 7. **Appeal.** Within 40 days after the filing of the award of damages any owner or
2.8 occupant may appeal from the award by filing a notice of appeal with the court administrator
2.9 of the district court of the county where the lands lie. However, the owner or occupant must
2.10 file the notice of appeal within ten days in order to delay the opening, construction, alteration,
2.11 change, or other improvement in or to the road pursuant to subdivision 10. The notice of
2.12 appeal ~~shall~~ must be accompanied by a bond of not less than ~~\$250~~ \$1,500, with sufficient
2.13 surety approved by the judge or the county auditor conditioned to pay all costs arising from
2.14 the appeal in case the award is sustained. A copy of the notice ~~shall~~ must be mailed by
2.15 registered or certified mail to the town clerk or any member of the town board. The notice
2.16 of appeal ~~shall~~ must specify the award or failure to award appealed from, the land to which
2.17 it relates, the nature and amount of the claim of appellant, and the grounds of the appeal,
2.18 which may include a challenge to the public purpose or necessity of the proposed road or
