This bill requires school districts to develop teacher mentoring programs and use staff development revenue for teacher mentorship programs.

Requires the commissioner to collaborate with particular organizations to develop a teacher mentorship model and make resources for implementing the model available to districts and charter schools.</p> <p><b>Subd. 2. Board grants.</b> Makes technical change.</p> <p><b>Subd. 3. Criteria for selection.</b> Makes technical change.</p> <p><b>Subd. 4. Additional funding.</b> Makes technical change.</p> <p><b>Subd. 5.
