

The Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board **does not support** removing CAAPB's ability to manage zoning and design (parking) in the Capitol area (SF3045, 3rd Engrossment, Section 15, lines 26.25-26.27) and engage with partners through the process of determining the appropriate level for parking minimums in the Capitol Area. The Capitol Area serves Minnesotans from across the state, and it's essential we retain a balanced, collaborative approach to shaping its future.
