

HUD CoC Impact on Minnesota's Homeless Response



HUD CoC funding is vital across Minnesota, helping to establish and sustain housing, rental assistance, and support service programs. Changes to federal funding will threaten programs and housing that combine these resources with Minnesota state funds, along with essential systems and tools those programs rely on.



Rental Assistance

Money provided to help people pay rent so they can live in safe housing.
The goal is to make housing affordable.



Support Services

Help provided to people so they can stay housed, e.g. case management, employment support, crisis assistance.
The goal is to support long-term success in housing.



Administration

Work needed to run programs, e.g. keep records, manage financials, processes, policies and reporting
The goal is to make sure program are compliant and running smoothly.



HMIS

Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) is a data base used to keep information about people experiencing homelessness.
The goal is to track services provided, program and system outcomes.



Coordinated Entry

A community-wide process for people experiencing homelessness to get help and find housing.
The goal is to provide pathways out of homelessness and manage community resources.



Planning Grants

Funds given to a region to organize in the local community & improve its homeless response system.
The goal is to make the system work better for everyone.
