

Free Income Tax Filing

Who qualifies?

• You may qualify for free electronic filing if your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) is \$72,000 or less.

Why file electronically?

- You will be using the most up-to-date forms and instructions.
- It takes you step-by-step through the filing process.
- It saves you from having to take the time to mail in your return.



COVID-19 Related Actions

- Change to Liquor Posting
 - Businesses required to suspend or reduce services under Executive Order 20-04 will not be subject to Liquor Posting for taxes and returns due February 1, 2020, to four months after the Executive Order ends.
- Change to Tax or Debt Collection
 - Taxpayers experiencing financial hardship due to COVID-19 and are concerned about paying tax debt or other agency debt can contact us to discuss available options.
 - We are committed to working with our customers during this difficult time.

- Many free tax return preparation sites in Minnesota suspended or limited their services last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Some of our VITA partners do expect to return to in-person services this filing season with proper precautions in place, and we are working with many of our partners to establish a virtual option for taxpayers.
- A list of in-person and virtual VITA sites will be on our website later this month once filing season is open and the sites have completed their certification.

Relief Programs

- Local Government Distributions
 - \$841 million was authorized for distribution to local governments
 - \$838 million was paid to eligible jurisdictions which submitted certifications
 - 1,615 out of 1,888 eligible jurisdictions received an aid payment from the federal Coronavirus Relief Fund
- Business Relief Payments
 - Providing aid for restaurants, bars, gyms, and bowling centers that meet the qualifications under the December 2020 law.
