## Pass Emergency COVID Relief Funding for Home and Community-Based Service Providers (HF XX/ SF XX)

50 HCBS providers were recently surveyed, asking about the financial impact of COVID-19 on their organizations and the services they provide.



**\$2.65 million** in lost revenue from open beds from 1/1 -6/30/2020, because the individuals being supported had moved home with their families

Respondents reported increased expenses, such as PPE & hazard pay, costing almost **\$12 million** 

#### **Stable Workforce**

 State funding that supports meaningful wages for Direct Support Professionals

• Study the impact of minimum wage increases across the state (HF XX/ SF XX)



#### Access to Tech

• Make Minnesota a "Technology First" state (HF XX/ SF XX)

#### Support the Service Spectrum: Address funding shortfalls for ICF/IDD services

The last rate adjustment for ICF/IDD Services was in 2015 at 1%.

Our legislation will make it possible for providers to request a rate change when an individual's needs change, reimburse residential providers delivering services during the day at equivalent rates to a day service provider and provides for an across the board rate increase for ICF/IDD services.
