Subject Community Education; Adults with Disabilities Revenue

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Overview

A school district with an approved program may offer programs for adults with disabilities as part of its community education program. Adults with disabilities programs may include outreach activities to identify adults needing service, classes specifically for adults with disabilities, services enabling the adults to participate in community education, and activities to increase public awareness and enhance the role of people with disabilities in the community.

Revenue for the program has been capped for more than 25 years and the limited state aid is provided to the same 63 programs first selected to participate at that point in time. State aid equals the lesser of \$30,000, or one-half of the actual program expenditures. Note that some districts provide the programming jointly with other school districts. The remainder of a district's adults with disabilities program revenue is composed of funds from other public or private sources, or an optional levy not to exceed \$30,000 or one-half of the approved program budget.

H.F. 1045 creates a new formula for all school districts in the state that offer an adults with disabilities program and sets the revenue equal to \$1 per capita. A small equalized levy accompanies the state aid.
