

2021-2022 Statewide Chronic Absenteeism: 30.2% (236,101 Students)






















2022-2023 Statewide Chronic Absenteeism: 25.5% (199,185 Students)





















Lost Learning Days Adding Up

Students who were chronically absent missed...

...at least 3.1 million combined days of school

...and at least 15.9 million hours of instructional time

A Crisis in All Corners of the State

- In 60 districts across the state, over half of all students are not regularly attending school.
- There are 240 schools with 50% or higher chronic absenteeism
- Statewide 36% of students living in poverty were chronically absent
- These numbers are small improvements from last year, but there is much work to be done



Notes on consistent attendance/chronic absenteeism

-Chronically absent = 10% or more of school days missed due to excused or unexcused absences, as well as out of school suspensions

-Students are considered "<u>in attendance</u>" when on field trips, at sporting events, or other extra curricular activities

-"In general, if a school employee is being paid to supervise or provide services to a student, that student will be counted as in attendance."


-Only students enrolled at least half the school year are counted for the consistent attendance/chronic absenteeism indicator











Data Questions

Can we get timelier data?

Can we disaggregate chronic absenteeism data by type of absence? (Excused, unexcused, suspension)

Can we report attendance data by age? (Elementary, middle, high school)

Can we get a better sense of the severity of absenteeism by reporting the number of days missed? As well as habitual chronic absenteeism (attendance issues multiple years in a row)

The following schools are Rhode Island's attendance leaders for the week of February 10, 2025*:

- Elementary: Hope Valley Elementary School, Chariho 98.1%
- Middle: West Broadway Middle School, Providence 97.4%
- High School: Segue IFL Legacy High School 95.6%

Special recognition is extended to the following schools for demonstrating the most improved average attendance rates from the previous week:

- **Elementary:** Arlington Elementary School, Cranston 10.2%
- Middle: Samuel Slater Middle School, Pawtucket 8.0%
- High School: Apprenticeship Exploration School, Cranston 12.5%

The Governor and Commissioner express their gratitude and encouragement to all schools in Rhode Island for their ongoing efforts to prioritize attendance and reinforce the value of consistent learning experiences for all students.

REAL TIME ATTENDANCE DASHBOARDS

This set of dashboards lets you dig deep into real time data. The site refreshes daily. You can examine changes from this year to last, examine attendance by multiple subgroups, look at weekly and monthly attendance trends, and track early dismissals and tardies.

NOTE: Please recognize that this data is feeding directly from RIDE's data warehouse. Data are collected from LEAs nightly but there are always lags in collection and reporting. It is important to keep this in mind as you look at these charts and tables.





12,429 students are already chronically absent (18+ absences) in 2024-25

(This figure is based on data that districts submit to RIDE. Districts are expected to submit attendance data to RIDE daily. Some of these numbers may be due to non-reporting. This dashboard will be updated daily as we continue to improve data collection and quality.)
