Proven programs like the Small Business Assistance Partnerships provide strong and sustained returns on investment. Let's continue to resource what works!


\$7.4 million for Small Business Assistance Partnerships

The Small Business Assistance
Partnerships program contracts with
trusted and regionally aligned
nonprofits to provide high-quality free
professional business development,
education, subject matter expertise and
technical assistance.

In 2023 alone, the partnership assisted nearly 16,500 businesses and created or retained more than 20,000 jobs — but the program faces a \$7.4 million budgetary shortfall in the next biennium.

We need to close that gap to continue to propel prosperity for tens of thousands of small businesses across the state.

Elevate Community Business Academy | Kandiyohi County, MN

The Elevate Community Business Academy, is a partnership between the Southwest Initiative Foundation, Kandiyohi County Economic Development, and Rising Tide Capitol with funding support from MN DEED's Small Business Assistance Partnerships Program. Since starting in 2021, Elevate has had 103 graduates that resulted in 35 new small businesses in Kandiyohi County alone. These small businesses range from grocery stores, a 500-head goat farm, and an event center. These small businesses not only help serve their communities, but they also generate economic activity and strengthen communities in Kandiyohi County.
