# **OUTDOOR HERITAGE FUND Recommendations Bill Summary Fiscal Year 2026**

# **LSOHC** Recommendations Highlights

In the seventeenth years of Outdoor Heritage Funding (OHF), the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council is recommending a total of 50 programs be funded by the MN Legislature for a total of \$168,512,000.

- 106,778 acres of wildlife habitat throughout Minnesota is estimated to be restored, enhanced, and/or protected.
- 68 miles of shoreline will be restored, enhanced and/or protected.
- An additional \$30,753,300 in federal, local government, and private conservation funding is expected to be leveraged with FY2026 OHF.
- 29 different organizations are recommended for funding (2 state agencies, 10 local units of government, and 17 non-government organizations).
- Continued investment in robust on going programs constitutes 94% of the • programs recommended.
- Activities include: native prairie protection, wetland restoration, trout stream enhancement, public wildlife land enhancements, shallow lake enhancement, forest fragmentation prevention, strategic land acquisition in fee and conservation easement, invasive species removal, restoring fish passage and pollinator habitat.

#### Constitutional Amendment - Article XI—Sec. 15.

...33 percent of the receipts shall be deposited in the outdoor heritage fund and may be spent only to restore, protect, and enhance wetlands, prairies, forests, and habitat for fish, game, and wildlife;...

...The dedicated money under this section must supplement traditional sources of funding for these purposes and may not be used as a substitute. Land acquired by fee with money deposited in the outdoor heritage fund under this section must be open to the public taking of fish and game during the open season unless otherwise provided by law...
