

1.1 moves to amend H.F. No. 1271 as follows:

1.2 Page 2, after line 25, insert:

1.3 "Sec. Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 342.01, subdivision 50, is amended to read:

1.4 Subd. 50. **Lower-potency hemp edible.** (a) "Lower-potency hemp edible" means any
1.5 product that:

1.6 (1) is intended to be eaten or consumed as a beverage by humans;

1.7 (2) contains hemp concentrate or an artificially derived cannabinoid, in combination
1.8 with food ingredients;

1.9 (3) is not a drug;

1.10 (4) does not contain a cannabinoid derived from cannabis plants or cannabis flower;

1.11 (5) is a type of product approved for sale by the office or is substantially similar to a
1.12 product approved by the office, including but not limited to products that resemble
1.13 nonalcoholic beverages, candy, and baked goods; and

1.14 (6) meets either of the requirements in paragraph (b).

1.15 (b) A lower-potency hemp edible includes:

1.16 (1) a product that:

1.17 (i) consists of servings that contain no more than five milligrams of delta-9
1.18 tetrahydrocannabinol; no more than ~~25~~ 100 milligrams of cannabidiol, cannabigerol,
1.19 cannabinol, or cannabichromene; any other cannabinoid authorized by the office; or any
1.20 combination of those cannabinoids that does not exceed the identified amounts;

1.21 (ii) does not contain more than a combined total of 0.5 milligrams of all other
1.22 cannabinoids per serving; and

2.1 (iii) does not contain an artificially derived cannabinoid other than delta-9
2.2 tetrahydrocannabinol, except that a product may include artificially derived cannabinoids
2.3 created during the process of creating the delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol that is added to the
2.4 product, if no artificially derived cannabinoid is added to the ingredient containing delta-9
2.5 tetrahydrocannabinol and the ratio of delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol to all other artificially
2.6 derived cannabinoids is no less than 20 to one; or

2.7 (2) a product that:

2.8 (i) contains hemp concentrate processed or refined without increasing the percentage of
2.9 targeted cannabinoids or altering the ratio of cannabinoids in the extracts or resins of a hemp
2.10 plant or hemp plant parts beyond the variability generally recognized for the method used
2.11 for processing or refining or by an amount needed to reduce the total THC in the hemp
2.12 concentrate; and

2.13 (ii) consists of servings that contain no more than five milligrams of total THC."

2.14 Page 3, after line 3, insert:

2.15 "Sec. Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 342.46, subdivision 6, is amended to read:

2.16 Subd. 6. **Compliant products.** (a) A lower-potency hemp edible retailer shall ensure
2.17 that all lower-potency hemp edibles offered for sale comply with the limits on the amount
2.18 and types of cannabinoids that a lower-potency hemp edible can contain, including but not
2.19 limited to the requirement that lower-potency hemp edibles:

2.20 (1) consist of servings that contain no more than five milligrams of delta-9
2.21 tetrahydrocannabinol; no more than ~~25~~ 100 milligrams of cannabidiol, ~~no more than 25~~
2.22 ~~milligrams of~~ cannabigerol, cannabinol, or cannabichromene; any other cannabinoid
2.23 authorized by the office; or any combination of those cannabinoids that does not exceed
2.24 the identified amounts;

2.25 (2) do not contain more than a combined total of 0.5 milligrams of all other cannabinoids
2.26 per serving; and

2.27 (3) do not contain an artificially derived cannabinoid other than delta-9
2.28 tetrahydrocannabinol.

2.29 (b) If a lower-potency hemp edible is packaged in a manner that includes more than a
2.30 single serving, the lower-potency hemp edible must indicate each serving by scoring,
2.31 wrapping, or other indicators that appear on the lower-potency hemp edible designating the
2.32 individual serving size. If it is not possible to indicate a single serving by scoring or use of

3.1 another indicator that appears on the product, the lower-potency hemp edible may not be
3.2 packaged in a manner that includes more than a single serving in each container, except
3.3 that a calibrated dropper, measuring spoon, or similar device for measuring a single serving
3.4 may be used for any edible cannabinoid products that are intended to be combined with
3.5 food or beverage products prior to consumption. If the lower-potency hemp edible is meant
3.6 to be consumed as a beverage, the beverage container may not contain more than two
3.7 servings per container.

3.8 (c) A single package containing multiple servings of a lower-potency hemp edible must
3.9 contain no more than 50 milligrams of delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol, ~~250~~; no more than
3.10 1,000 milligrams of cannabidiol, ~~250 milligrams of~~ cannabigerol, cannabinol, or
3.11 cannabichromene; any other cannabinoid authorized by the office; or any combination of
3.12 those cannabinoids that does not exceed the identified amounts."
