

1.1 ..... moves to amend H.F. No. 1184, the first engrossment, as follows:

1.2 Page 16, after line 1, insert:

1.3 **"Veterans in Crisis Deescalation Training.**

1.4 Of this amount, up to \$100,000 each year  
 1.5 of the biennium may be spent for training  
 1.6 state and local community safety personnel  
 1.7 in the use of crisis deescalation techniques  
 1.8 for use with Minnesota veterans following  
 1.9 their return from active military service in  
 1.10 a combat zone. The commissioner must  
 1.11 consult with the director of the Minnesota  
 1.12 Peace Officers and Training Board, and  
 1.13 may consult with any other state or local  
 1.14 governmental official or nongovernmental  
 1.15 authority the commissioner determines to be  
 1.16 relevant, when selecting a service provider  
 1.17 for this training. Among any other criteria  
 1.18 the commissioner may establish for the  
 1.19 selection, the training provider must have a  
 1.20 demonstrated understanding of the transitions  
 1.21 and challenges that veterans may experience  
 1.22 during their reentry into society following  
 1.23 combat service. The commissioner must  
 1.24 ensure that training opportunities provided  
 1.25 are reasonably distributed statewide."
