1.5 Subd. 4. **Riding rules.** (a) Every person operating a bicycle upon a roadway shall
1.6 ~~ride as close as practicable to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway~~ ride in the
1.7 right-hand lane then available for traffic except under any of the following situations:

1.8 (1) when overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction;

1.9 (2) when preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into a private road or driveway;

1.10 (3) when reasonably necessary to avoid conditions, including fixed or moving
1.11 objects, vehicles, pedestrians, animals, surface hazards, ~~or~~ narrow width lanes, ~~that make~~
1.12 ~~it~~ or other conditions that in the judgment of the cyclist make it unsafe to continue along
1.13 ~~the right-hand curb or edge~~ in the right-hand lane; or

1.14 (4) when operating on the shoulder of a roadway or in a bicycle lane.

1.15 (b) If a bicycle is traveling on a shoulder of a roadway, the bicycle shall travel in the
1.16 same direction as adjacent vehicular traffic.

1.17 (c) Persons riding bicycles upon a roadway or shoulder shall not ride more than two
1.18 abreast and shall not impede the normal and reasonable movement of traffic and, on a
1.19 laned roadway, shall ride within a single lane.

1.20 (d) A person operating a bicycle upon a sidewalk, or across a roadway or shoulder
1.21 on a crosswalk, shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian and shall give an audible
1.22 signal when necessary before overtaking and passing any pedestrian. No person shall ride
1.23 a bicycle upon a sidewalk within a business district unless permitted by local authorities.
1.24 Local authorities may prohibit the operation of bicycles on any sidewalk or crosswalk
1.25 under their jurisdiction.

2.1 (e) An individual operating a bicycle or other vehicle on a bikeway shall leave a safe
2.2 distance when overtaking a bicycle or individual proceeding in the same direction on the
2.3 bikeway, and shall maintain clearance until safely past the overtaken bicycle or individual.

2.4 (f) A person lawfully operating a bicycle on a sidewalk, or across a roadway or
2.5 shoulder on a crosswalk, shall have all the rights and duties applicable to a pedestrian
2.6 under the same circumstances.

2.7 (g) A person may operate an electric-assisted bicycle on the shoulder of a roadway,
2.8 on a bikeway, or on a bicycle trail if not otherwise prohibited under section 85.015,
2.9 subdivision 1d; 85.018, subdivision 2, paragraph (d); or 160.263, subdivision 2, paragraph
2.10 (b), as applicable.

2.11 (h) Upon approaching an intersection where right turns are permitted and there is a
2.12 dedicated right-turn lane, a bicyclist may ride in the left-hand portion of the dedicated
2.13 right-turn lane and subsequently proceed through the intersection without turning right."
