



Disability provider rate increases are set by the legislature. No general adjustment takes place without a change in law - there are no underlying statutory adjustments for base rates to reflect underlying changes in costs.

- Provider rate increases have not kept up with inflation over the past 6 years, there is a 13 percent difference between rates and the CPI. HF 315 starts to remedy this by providing a 3 percent COLA to home & community based service providers and ICF/MRs
- Over three quarters 76 percent of payments to providers goes to employee compensation
- In years with a 50 percent Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) rate, every \$1 change in state funding results in a net \$2 impact in overall funding to providers (i.e. \$2 million increase in MA funding results in an overall \$4 million in payments)
