

2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials - Gymnastics

For 10 days in June, Minnesota became the epicenter of gymnastics as we welcomed 200,000 fans to our region. Televised primetime on NBC, the event culminated with the announcement of the gymnasts, including Minnesotan Suni Lee, who represented Team USA in Paris.

- 200,000 fans descended upon downtown Minneapolis during the 10 day gymnastic events
- Total economic impact is estimated at \$74.8M over the course of the entire event¹ with direct spend from consumers to local businesses a remarkable \$38.6M.¹
- \$6 Million in state funds spurred local, regional and national excitement, generating \$5.75M in tax revenue.¹





2024 Women's and Men's Big Ten Basketball Tournaments

March Madness descended upon Target Center as Minnesota hosted a second consecutive record-breaking Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament and a week later, the Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament.

- Total Economic Impact is estimated at \$52M amassing \$5M in tax revenue; public funds spent totalling just \$1M
- First time ever SELL-OUT for Women's Tournament; 121,000 fans stayed in our hotels, ate in our restaurants!
- Highest hotel occupancy since 2019 83% in Minneapolis during Women's Tournament week

MNSE leads the way in bringing vitality back to Minnesota

- Since the pandemic, two of the three highest hotel occupancy rate periods have been during MNSE events.
- More than 60% of ticket buyers to these major events were visitors from outside Minnesota

2026 WWE SummerSlam

 The 2026 edition will be the first ever two-night Summer Slam with an expected attendance of more than 100,000 and an estimated economic impact of more than \$100 million.

• The Concacaf Gold Cup is our flagship event for men's national teams and the 2025, played at U.S. Bank Stadium

2027 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Preliminary Championship
