

Textbooks and other course resources can be expensive, but they don't have to be.



A **Z-degree** is a complete associate or bachelor's degree program that exclusively uses course resources that are **zero-cost** to students.

Thanks to funding from the Minnesota Legislature, Minnesota State has accelerated its Z-degree efforts and increased its impact for students.

Z-Degree Impacts

- Student savings reached \$3.1 million in the 2024 academic year.
- Savings to over 126,000 Minnesota State students totals \$12.6 million since the inception of Z-degrees.
- Z-degrees impact the equity gap for students of color, first-generation students, and students who receive Pell Grants.

Library Support

Z-degree courses can provide resources at nocost thanks to open educational resources, open

textbooks, and library-curated materials. With system and Legislative funds, Minnesota State supports faculty, staff, and librarians in finding or developing high-quality resources.

Funding helps support:

- An OER faculty development coordinator
- An OER librarian and an OER support librarian
- Access to Leganto, allowing easy resource integration for online courses
- EBSCO ebook subscriptions
- Access to online publishing platforms
- Creative Commons certification courses
