PFA Drinking Water (State) Revolving Fund for LSLR

- DWSRF contains mix of federal funds, state match, loan repayments
- Federal law allows a small portion of annual federal capitalization funds to be provided to projects as principal forgiveness grants
 - State statutes authorize PF grants to replace the privately owned portion of lead service lines (50% of project costs up to \$250,000)
- First LSLR award to St. Paul in July 2021
 - 97 lines replaced to date
- Seven other projects on 2022 MDH Project Priority List



Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)

IIJA appropriates a total of \$668 million over five years for water infrastructure through PFA State Revolving Funds

- Three project categories
 - Supplemental funds for existing CWSRF and DWSRF programs (\$60M+/yr)
 - Emerging contaminants (\$13.2M+/yr)
 - Lead service line replacement (\$43.1M/yr)
 - 49% can be provided as principal forgiveness grants (51% loan)
 - No required state match
 - Projects following existing DWSRF funding process, starting with submitting project proposals to MDH for the Project Priority List and to PFA for the annual Intended Use Plan



Current Lead Service Line Activity

- Still waiting for EPA to issue formal IIJA guidance
- Lead service line inventories
 - EPA regulations require all public water suppliers to complete by Oct 2024
 - MDH working with cities to help guide efforts
- MDH/PFA discussions with cities and consultants on how funding will work
- MDH and PFA now accepting project proposals for the 2023 PPL and IUP
- PFA expects to apply for Year 1 IIJA funds by Fall 2022
