

VIADUCT PARK

The City of Faribault is in the midst of construction of a fourseason municipal park (Viaduct Park) in the shadows of the historic Highway 60 viaduct on approximately 2.7 acres of Cityowned property.

This property is strategically located on the eastern edge of Faribault's historic downtown between the downtown Central Business District and the Straight River, a critically important asset to the community since the town's inception. The City has already broken ground on Phase 1, a \$6.3 million investment which includes a commons building, substantial site improvements and a splash pad.

Phase 2 - a \$5.29-millon, 17,000-square-foot covered refrigerated ice skating surface - will become the most iconic feature of the park and truly make it a four-season park with a substantial regional draw.

Our Local Government Capital request totals \$2.96 million to ensure we're able to see this project through.

A REGIONAL DRAW

- The amenities and green space will provide the region with a riverfront venue for public events, festivals, and gatherings.
- A park of this nature will increase the vitality and economically stimulate the second largest historic district in Minnesota.
- Foot traffic from a regional park will help encourage and facilitate positive, future growth in our downtown district.
- With two State Trails connecting the City to our neighbors and beyond, the City trail system links users to the park.
- A recreational, refrigerated outdoor rink gives our region and the State of Hockey something not seen outside the metro.
