

WATER FILTRATION PLANT



ENSURING CLEAN AND SAFE WATER FOR OUR COMMUNITY AND RESIDENTS

PROJECT

The water supply in the city of Henderson has high concentrations of iron and manganese, with iron being a primary concern. This elevated presence has led to various issues and complaints with water color, fixture staining, clogged pumps and sprinklers, metallic taste, and sediment buildup in the distribution system. Decreased water pressure is caused by the sediment buildup which is problematic to the local fire department.

A Water Pilot Study has already been conducted, which provided the necessary treatment and sizing requirements for a water filtration plant. The city has also started increasing water utility rates to local residents and businesses.

This water filtration project would involve designing and building a drinking water filtration plant and connecting it to the existing well and distribution systems in the city.

The project is ready to start final design and preparation of bidding documents.

FUNDING REQUEST

\$3,000,000

The City of Henderson is requesting \$3M in bonding bill assistance, which would fund 50% of the Water Filtration Plant project. The remaining project cost will be funded by local sources and potential federal funding requests.
