



U.S. outlook improved since November




U.S. recovery expected to persist



State unemployment rate down from May peak





Minnesota employment fell in 2020






Leisure and hospitality sector hit hardest



Through December, there were 123,400 fewer leisure and hospitality jobs in Minnesota than there were in February resulting in a 44% drop in employment. Through December, all other sectors combined have 113,000 fewer jobs.

Lowest wage-earners most affected






Duration of unemployment longer for lower-wage workers (U.S.)


Change in U.S. Employment by Income Level


Consumer spending shifted away from some services
