#### **Bill Description**

A bill for an act requiring adoption of rules establishing the PFOA and PFOS water quality standards by July 1, 2026, and requiring by July 1, 2025, the commissioner of health must amend the health risk limit for perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) in Minnesota Rules, part 4717.7860, subpart 15, so that the health risk limit does not exceed 0.015 parts per billion.

### **Assumptions**

- 1. The costs reflected in this analysis only address Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) costs and are over and above current program appropriations to the MPCA.
- 2. We assume that the requirements of this law will be met by the MPCA's currently in progress rulemaking project to update the Class 1 water quality standards (WQS). The Class 1 WQS apply to all groundwater and surface waters designated as sources of drinking water, and MPCA has already made clear its intent to add WQS for six PFAS in this rulemaking.
- 3. The Class 1 rulemaking process began with a Request for Comment (RFC) published on November 29, 2021. A second RFC is planned for FY23, and the rulemaking will be completed prior to the July 1, 2026 deadline.
- 4. This is assumed to be a major rulemaking, so expenditures were estimated based on a rulemaking of similar scope and size, as laid out in the Minnesota Rulemaking Manual prepared by MDH and adjusted based on MPCA's past rulemaking experiences. Costs were apportioned across fiscal years depending on timing of process steps. Since this would be a new numeric water quality standard, peer review is required, per statute. The MPCA prefers to reimburse reviewers for their time spent reviewing the technical documents. MPCA estimates 3-5 reviewers at \$500-\$1500 each.

# **Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula**

#### **Bill Description**

HF1283, Sec. 1, provides for the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) to conduct rulemaking to adopt rules establishing water quality standards for perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) and perfluorooctanesulfonic acid (PFOS). HF1283, Sec. 2, provides for the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) to conduct rulemaking to amend the rules for health risk limits for perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS).

### **Assumptions**

The Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) has used MPCA's assumption that administrative costs for this rulemaking will total \$61,820 divided across FY2023, FY2024, and FY2025. Of the estimated rulemaking administrative cost amount of \$61,820, \$5,000 is for the estimated 20 hours of administrative law judge (ALJ) time in FY2024, and \$40,000 is for the estimated 163 hours of ALJ time in FY2025.

Based on past practices, OAH assumes that rulemaking required of MDH to amend the health risk limit for PFOS in Minn. R. 4717.7860, supb. 5, would require a medium rulemaking under chapter 14 which requires an estimated 50 hours of ALJ time for activity related to rulemaking procedures. Of the estimated rulemaking amount of \$134,876, \$12,250 is for the estimated 50 hours of ALJ time for a medium rulemaking.

OAH currently bills ALJ time for rulemaking at the MMB-approved billable rate of \$245 per hour (see Minn. Stat. § 16A.126, subd. 1 (2022)).

# **Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula**

MPCA - Estimated 183 total hours of ALJ time for rulemaking activities related to implementing the requirements of Sec. 1, PFAS Water Quality Standards = 20 hours x \$245/hr = \$5,000 charged to MPCA in FY2024 plus 163 hours x \$245/hr = \$40,000 charged to MPCA in FY2025, pursuant to the requirements of Minn. Stat. § 14.53.

MDH - Estimated 50 hours of ALJ time for rulemaking activities related to implementing the requirements of Sec. 2, Health Risk Limit; Perfluorooctane Sulfonate = 50 hours x \$245/hr = \$12,250 charged to MDH in FY2025 pursuant to the requirements of Minn. Stat. § 14.53.

### **Bill Description**

The bill directs MDH to update the Health Risk Limit (HRL) for contaminants in groundwater for perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) into MN Rule 4717.7860, subpart 15 at a value equal to or lower than 0.015 parts per billion by July 1, 2025.

#### **Technical comments:**

The bill requires the department to develop rules for updating PFOS values by July 1, 2025. Based on experience with even minimal rule modifications, this timeline would be extremely challenging. A more achievable timeline would be July 1, 2026.

#### **Assumptions**

The department is experienced in establishing rules for contaminants in groundwater identical to what is required in this bill. Based on this experience, the department assumes this rulemaking effort would be comparable to a medium sized rule as detailed in the Minnesota Rulemaking Manual. The department assumes we will require staff time to conduct a toxicological assessment, draft rule language and supporting documentation materials, review and answer comments, and present information at a hearing held by an administrative law judge. Administrative costs will also be required as detailed in the Minnesota Rulemaking Manual. The department also assumes that rulemaking to update the PFOS HRL will not begin until the current rulemaking effort modifying MN Rule 4717 is completed. It is estimated that the current rulemaking will conclude by the end of July 2023. The department also assumes that to ensure the quickest adoption of the PFOS modifications to attempt to meet the July 1, 2025, deadline, this rulemaking effort will contain PFOS only. Other updated values increase the duration of rulemaking due to increased comments; questions from interested parties; longer and more complicated hearings; and additional staff time evaluating scientific literature for each value to be updated; and drafting rule language and supporting materials.
