The City of Lambertton has only one well that can meet the demands of the residents and businesses of Lambertton. This water supply does not meet industry standards and only has a 36 hour reserve supply in case of failure.

During peak water usage, the concrete company must shut down.

The city's water system has failed twice in the past 8 years, shutting down the water supply for all residents, business, Red Rock Central school district, and health care facilities.

Project Scope

- Two new wells that meet industry standards
- Sanitary sewer lift station
- Storm water pond and lengthy sewer outlet
- Installation of utilities under the Canadian Pacific railroad
- Construction of a right turn lane on US Hwy 14

Commercial and Industrial Business Development

The City of Lambertton owns 52 acres of land intended to become a business industrial park.



Currently the industrial park does not have municipal water, sanitary sewer, or storm sewer utilities necessary for the project.

Funds are committed to prepare construction plans, permits, survey/platting, and the storm water feasibility study needed to develop these industrial lots for sale.

The City has limited bond and tax capacity.

This project will immediately assist our school district, medical clinic, businesses and residents. Long term it will lead to an increase tax base and lower property tax burden.

As part of this project, the city will establish a reserve/replacement account.




