OES Background

- Established in 2017, reaffirmed by Executive Order (EO) 19-27 in 2019, and codified in state statute (Minn Statute § 16B.372) in 2023
- The EO directed State Government to conserve energy, water, and fossil fuels and reduce waste to save money
- The Statute directs Office of Enterprise Sustainability (OES) to assist state agencies in increasing efficiency of government operations by reducing the impact on the environment, controlling unnecessary waste of natural resources and funds, and spurring innovation by:
 - Managing a metrics and reporting dashboard
 - Assisting agencies in developing and executing sustainability plans
 - Sharing tools and best practices with local governments
- The Statute directs state agencies to develop a plan and make measurable progress toward improving efficiency outcomes

Enterprise Goals



Fleet

A 30% reduction in state fleet fossil fuel use by 2030 relative to a 2017 baseline.



Energy

A 30% reduction in building energy use per square foot by 2030 relative to a 2017 baseline.



Water

A 15% reduction in building water use per square foot by 2030 relative to a 2017 baseline.



Solid Waste

75% diversion rate (recycling and composting) by 2030.



Procurement

50% of solicitations in a calendar year have sustainable elements, as applicable.



Greenhouse Gases

A 50% reduction of greenhouse gas emissions by 2030 relative to a 2005 baseline.
