

1.1 Liebling and Scott from the Committee on Judiciary Finance and Civil Law to which
1.2 was referred:

1.3 H. F. No. 1567, A bill for an act relating to government data practices; extending to
1.4 public safety officers the personal information protections currently available for judicial
1.5 officials; amending Minnesota Statutes 2024, sections 13.991; 609.5151; proposing coding
1.6 for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 626.

1.7 Reported the same back with the following amendments:

1.8 Page 1, delete section 1 and insert:

1.9 "Section 1. [13.807] PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICER DATA; PERSONAL
1.10 INFORMATION.

1.11 (a) Subject to paragraph (b), the personal information of all public safety officers
1.12 collected, created, or maintained by a government entity is private data on individuals. For
1.13 purposes of this section, the terms "personal information" and "public safety officer" have
1.14 the meanings given in section 626.97, subdivision 1.

1.15 (b) If the responsible authority or government entity violates this chapter, the remedies
1.16 and penalties under this chapter are available only if the public safety officer making a claim
1.17 previously provided written notification to the responsible authority confirming on a form
1.18 provided by the commissioner of the Department of Public Safety that they are entitled to
1.19 protection under section 626.97. If the subject of the data is an adult child of a public safety
1.20 officer who does not reside with the public safety officer, the remedies and penalties under
1.21 this chapter are available only if the adult child previously provided written notification to
1.22 the responsible authority confirming their status as the child of a public safety officer. In
1.23 the case of county records, the form shall be filed with the responsible authority that maintains
1.24 the personal information for which the public safety officer is seeking protection. A form
1.25 submitted under this section is private data on individuals. A notice filed under this paragraph

2.1 expires five years following the date of filing, unless it is renewed prior to the expiration
2.2 date.

2.3 (c) This section shall not apply to personal information contained in:

2.4 (1) real property records as defined in section 13.045, subdivision 1, clause (5);

2.5 (2) Uniform Commercial Code filings and tax liens maintained by the secretary of state;
2.6 and

2.7 (3) any other records maintained by a government entity evidencing title to, or any lien,
2.8 judgment, or other encumbrance on, real or personal property."

2.9 Page 2, line 26, delete "both correctional officers and law enforcement officials" and
2.10 insert "a correctional officer or a law enforcement official"

2.11 Page 4, line 6, delete "or" and insert a comma and before the period insert ", a former
2.12 peace officer, or a former correctional officer"

2.13 Renumber the sections in sequence

2.14 Amend the title as follows:

2.15 Page 1, line 2, delete everything after the semicolon and insert "providing personal
2.16 information protections to public safety officers"

2.17 Page 1, line 3, delete everything before the semicolon

2.18 Correct the title numbers accordingly

2.19 With the recommendation that when so amended the bill be re-referred to the Committee
2.20 on Public Safety Finance and Policy.
