Funding request: HF2622 and SF2626

Lake Superior Center dba Great Lakes Aquarium (GLA) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization charged by the legislature to carry out a mission of delivering freshwater education. The Aquarium draws visitors from throughout the Midwest and beyond to explore and observe diverse animal habitats. Daily interpretive programs give guests the opportunity to learn more about resident animals while watching them eat, play, or interact with our staff. Robust youth programming includes early childhood classes, camps, art classes, field trips and overnights. In addition to on-site offerings, outreach programs bring the wonder of GLA to community partners and events around the region.

The Aquarium has reached a threshold where demand exceeds the original building's capacity. GLA is poised for growth and is seeking support to move from a successful local attraction to a vibrant regional experience.

Funding Request

Great Lakes Aquarium is requesting an appropriation of \$962,000 from the general fund for capital improvement projects and predesign for building expansion. The total project budget is \$1.1 million. Completion of these projects will improve water and energy conservation, increase staff and guest accessibility, expand educational offerings, and advance planning for exhibit gallery expansion.
