



## Modernizing Minnesota’s Only Dental School




**2026 CAPITAL REQUEST: \$100M | UNIVERSITY MATCH: \$50M**

Oral health is essential to overall well-being. As Minnesota’s only dental school, the University of Minnesota (UMN) is the primary engine for the state’s oral health workforce. We train **73% of Minnesota’s practicing dentists** and develop restorative materials used globally.

### The Opportunity: Address a Growing Workforce Gap

Minnesota faces a critical shortage: **approximately 160 dentists retire annually**, while UMN currently graduates only **120**. To support dental access statewide, we must expand our capacity. UMN has not undergone a major physical renovation since the mid-70s. While technology and teaching methods have evolved, the training space has not. To remain competitive and keep talent in-state, our facilities must evolve.



### The Proposal: Transforming Moos Tower

This request will modernize the 1970s-era Moos Tower, transforming it into a state-of-the-art hub for clinical care and education. This investment will:

- **Expand Capacity:** Additional teaching and clinical space allows us to increase capacity to bridge the dental practitioner gap.
- **Advance Technology:** Integrate digital workflows, 3D printing and flexible teaching labs.
- **Enhance Care:** Improve environments for treating special healthcare-needs patients and foster a “team care” clinical approach.
- **Ensure Safety:** Address critical infrastructure needs, including HVAC upgrades, asbestos removal and plumbing repairs.

### School of Dentistry at a Glance

- **Unmatched Impact:** Approximately 100,000 annual patient visits at Moos Tower and 20,000+ appointments at 24 outreach sites across Minnesota.
- **Safety Net Provider:** 48% of our patients use medical assistance; we are the state’s primary referral source for complex cases.
- **The Future Workforce:** Each year, we graduate 190+ professionals, including dentists, dental therapists, hygienists and residents.

**With state support, we can meet the needs of a 21st-century workforce and transform Minnesota’s dental school to better serve patients and communities across the state.**


## Current: 1970s-era Training and Clinical Spaces

### Educational Spaces



The current preclinical environment uses outdated equipment and does not align with real-world practice settings.

## Proposed: State-of-the-Art Hub for Clinical Care and Education



Conceptual designs add 50 spots for additional learners and provide learning spaces that mirror modern clinical settings.

### Clinical Care



The current clinical setting does not offer a modern experience for patients or space for collaborative learning.



Conceptual designs feature open learning centers between clinical areas to improve the patient and student experience.
