Overview

Wilderness Inquiry is a nonprofit organization that provides a variety of programming options designed to connect to individuals, including individuals with disabilities and individuals from underserved communities, with the outdoors.

H.F. 3948 appropriates \$494,000 in fiscal year 2023 to Wilderness Inquiry for credit recovery programs, capital expenses, and a fellowship program.

Summary

Section Description

1 Appropriation; Wilderness Inquiry credit recovery.

Appropriates \$494,000 in fiscal year 2023 from the general fund to the commissioner of education for a grant to Wilderness Inquiry. Requires Wilderness Inquiry to use \$290,000 for credit recovery activities, \$15,000 for accessibility equipment for youth with disabilities, \$145,000 for transportation needs, and \$44,000 for a fellowship program. Authorizes the appropriation to remain available until June 30, 2025.

Requires Wilderness Inquiry to form at least four partnerships with school district or charter school programs to deliver services through a model that enhances credit recovery program opportunities. Requires two partnerships in the 11-county metropolitan area and two partnerships with schools located in other counties.

Requires Wilderness Inquiry to report to the legislature on the use of the grant funds and the outcomes of its program.
