Legislative Issues to be Addressed

Our legislative solution for the 2025 Legislative Session proposes:

Limits the use of the conditional licensing penalty for serious violations when a license holder fails to follow health and safety requirements for residents or clients

Require DHS to use a collaborative safety model and alternative dispute resolutions for license holders to lower taxpayer costs, improve quality, and result in greater access to care for people with disabilities across the State of Minnesota

Create partnership and training services with culturally specific organizations to provide education on licensing requirements and staff, training, and informational assistance services to license holders
