How do Minnesota Libraries work?

Many types of libraries in Minnesota including:

- 356 public libraries
- 982 School libraries
- 90 Academic libraries
- 140 Special libraries
- 11 Tribal libraries
- 8 bookmobiles

Regional Public Library Systems



•12 regional public library systems

- Consolidated: centralized administration with branch libraries
- Federated: independent member libraries
- •356 public library locations
- •8 bookmobiles
- •At least one library in every county

Minnesota Multi-County, Multi-Types Library Systems



•7 multi-type systems

- 3 merged with regional systems
- 4 not merged

- School libraries
- Public libraries
- Academic libraries

- •\$1.3M = annual funding

What's happening in Minnesota Libraries?

- 47% of the total MN population are registered cardholders (60% if you include the reciprocal numbers). This means 1 in 2 Minnesotans have a library card!
- You don't even have to have a library card 9.7 million visits to libraries in 2021 that's more than seven times the attendance at the MN State Fair in 2021
- Total materials circulation is 43 million, which is 16 checkouts per cardholder
- 11 million checkouts of downloadable ebooks, audio and video, and digital magazines
- All Minnesotans have access to 9,000 ebooks through eBooksMN and 57 research tools through eLibrary Minnesota
- 74% of MN libraries have space for community meetings; over 37,000 community meetings took place in Minnesota public libraries in 2021
- 465,000 people attended the 23,374 library programs offered by libraries in 2021. 10,000 in-person programs for kids, with 1,500 live virtual programs and 4,000 recorded programs

What's happening in Minnesota Libraries?

- Minnesotans had access to 4,800 computers and mobile devices at libraries that's an average of 34 devices per library
- Minnesota libraries logged 7 million computer and wireless sessions in 2021
- 40% of Minnesota's libraries have partnerships with workforce development organizations
- 70% provide services to organizations serving seniors
- 95% of Minnesota public libraries participate in interlibrary loan through Minitex. With this system, library patrons can request books, journal articles, and audiovisual material from all types of libraries in Minnesota.
- Through interlibrary loan, public libraries borrowed 1,060,788 items and lent 1,091,449 items.
