Re: Universal School Meals

Dear Chair Youakim and Members of the Committee:

We are writing to ask for your support for HF 5, a bill which would include school breakfast and lunch at no cost to all Minnesota students. While the federal government decided against continuing this pandemic-era program, Minnesota has an opportunity to fill that void and recognize the financial hardships many families are still facing while also eliminating the stigma that many students who receive free or reduced-price meals confront.

At Cargill, supplying people around the globe with safe, nutritious food and ingredients is at the core of our purpose. Cargill is a proud and strong financial supporter of organizations such as Every Meal, Second Harvest Heartland, and food shelves across the state who take on the challenge of addressing hunger every day.
