CHALLENGES

- Vocational and technical programs require additional space to increase learning opportunities for students.
- More than 50 Fairmont area businesses have a significant need for skilled employees with technical and vocational training.
- According to the Minnesota Chamber of Commerce and the State of Minnesota, Minnesota will experience a shortage of nearly 239,000 workers involving every industry in all parts of the state beginning in 2022. Even with employer-funded customized training, there aren't enough workers to fill these good-paying jobs. 2021 marks the first time that the population of Minnesotans over age 65 will exceed the school-age population.


SOLUTIONS

- Provide additional space at the Fairmont Area High School for vocational programs that increase students' opportunities to receive job/career training for immediate job opportunities in the Fairmont area.
- Attract and retain our own Fairmont talent for jobs. Preparing Fairmont area school students to fill these good-paying jobs required by our Fairmont area employers, several with starting wages over \$50,000 per year and, right in our own back yard, is a win-win solution to help our local employers attract and retain the skilled workers they need to compete.

EXPANDEDWOODSHOP


The current program has grown and requires additional learning space for students to continue to build a variety of cabinetry and woodworking projects.

CONSTRUCTION AND MANUFACTURING LAB

The construction and manufacturing lab will enable students to build residential homes, garages, fish houses, and tiny houses that can be moved to a site within the community upon completion. Students learn framing, electrical, plumbing, roofing, sheetrocking, windows installation, trim work, and siding.

AUTOMOTIVE SHOP EXPANSION

The current automotive shop requires additional space for current and future projects to expand the program and provide appropriate learning space for vehicles, engines, and equipment.



PROGRAMMING LAB

he former woodshop space will be repurposed as an equipment programming lab that our mechatronic class and robotics students will utilize. The area will include 3D printers, wood/netal/glass engravers, flight simulators, and Computer Numerical Control (CNC) equipment, which will allow students to design and program equipment to perform tasks at local industry standards.

HEATING, VENTILATION, AIR CONDITIONING, AND REFRIGERATION LAB (HVACR)

In this new program, students will learn the skills needed to work on the mechanical systems and equipment in commercial buildings, including heating, ventilation, air conditioning, refrigeration, and digital control systems. This program will connect with local Fairmont area businesses, engineering schools, technical colleges, and experts in the building industry to provide a highquality learning experience that reflects where the industry is today and where it is going in the future. This program will allow our students to obtain college credits and technical certifications during High School, so they are eligible for apprenticeships, internships, or jobs.

SCHOOL VEHICLE STORAGE

The Maintenance and Grounds Department needs additional space for school vehicles currently at the school maintenance shop. The existing four-stall garage at this location will be relocated near the new vocational building to allow staff access to vehicles to transport 7th - 12th-grade students to school activities throughout the day.
