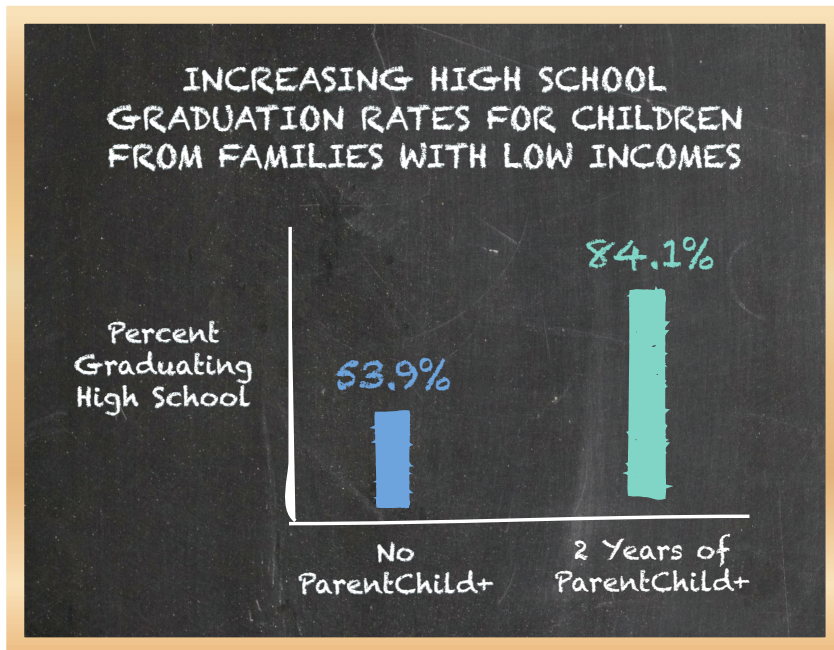

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

ParentChild+ is an intensive home visiting program for families with children ages 2-4 that supports families with school readiness, parenting skills and child development—at no cost to the family. It helps children from communities that are underserved bridge the opportunity gap and prepare them for success in school by bringing highly-trained early learning specialists into the families’ homes for twice-weekly visits over a two-year period.



ParentChild+

helps parents as their child’s first and most important teacher, modeling new ways to interact with their child and introducing opportunities to impact their child’s developmental growth.

99% of families showed an increase in parent/child communication techniques that promote language/literacy skills of children

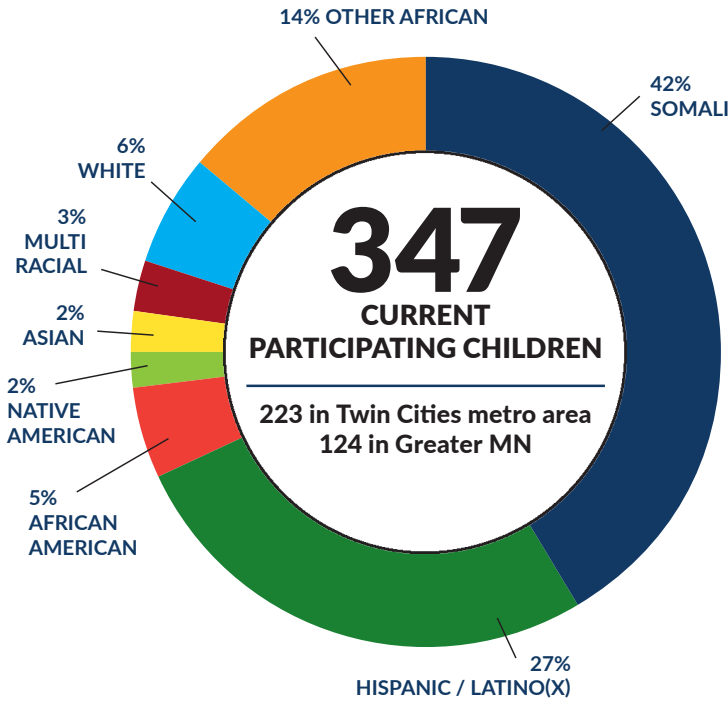

Compared to their socio-economic peers, ParentChild+ children are:

50% more likely to be ready for kindergarten

50% less likely to need special education services by third grade
